Just a note to express our deep appreciation for DAHA's generous support of Horses' Honor Rescue.

The economy has been particularly difficult for horses. Many have been abandoned and neglected. As a horse owner, I have been troubled by what I have seen—many painful images that are very difficult to shake.

Over the years I have searched for a horse rescue that I could trust. Horses' Honor Horse Rescue & Sanctuary is that organization. Top quality, ethical, caring—all of these words describe Horses Honor Rescue. When I visited them this fall, I was blown away by what I saw. Horses were nestled in private pastures that have been donated by the generous citizens of Auburn, and great care has gone into being sure that each horse has pasture mates that are compatible. 100% of their funds go to feeding and caring for the horses-- many of whom have been rescued from kill auctions and were skeletal when they arrived—some so bony that they were actually rejected by the slaughter houses as being too thin to process. Nina Clark, the director and founder of Horses' Honor Rescue, is dedicated to their care and visits each pasture a couple of times a day to feed and to check on the horses. Her visits include grooming and affectionate hands-on care. It is clear that the horses, many of whom have been so badly abused that they have every right to never trust another human again, trust and love Nina. They trot to the fences to greet her. The bond is palpable.

I feel so honored to be a part of this organization. From the bottom of my heart and on behalf of other volunteers and the sweet horses of Horses' Honor, thank you for your very generous and on-going support. You have made a huge difference in the lives of these horses, and it is deeply appreciated by many.
