TEVIS

The Western States Trail Foundation(USTF) main function is to put on the 100 Mile Tevis Cup Endurance Horse Ride every year from Tahoe to Auburn. This year the USFT Board of Governors voted to introduce a new trophy, The Wendeu Robie Cup. This award is in honor of Wendeu Robie who was the Founder of the 100 Mile Tevis Ride. This trophy was presented to any and all horses that have successfully completed the Tevis Cup Ride five or more times over the past 62 years. There have been 57 horses that have finished 5 or more Tevis Cup Rides over the past 62 years. One of these horses is a Russian Arabian "Monty" owned by Bob 2 Marx, a longtime member of DAHA. Bob was his rider all 6 times

he finished the Tevis Cup Ride.

YOUTH UPDATE

ARABIANS ON THE TRAIL

Arabians are not just pretty faces...they are working horses, too! These Arabs traveled from Brentwood to Utah via Barstow and Flagstaff to take their riders on a trip of a lifetime at Monument Valley Navajo Tribal Park this past May. Marla Melloway with her mares, Pakhita and Sundae, Penny Marrs and her 25 year old mare, Crystallite, and Sheila Walsh riding her young gelding, Billy the Kid, explored Monument Valley with 18 other ladies for 5 straight days in some very tough terrain. Navajo sandstone, deep sand dunes, hard pack, steep climbs, and 45-60 degree downhills were the norm, covering a total of 64.2 mi in the five days out. These horses never missed a beat, loved the challenge, and safely carried their riders to the pinnacle of technical riding facing everything from free roaming horse bands, no water from morning to afternoon, drop-off trails, and gawker-riders with cameras
